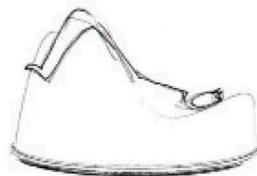
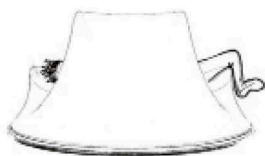

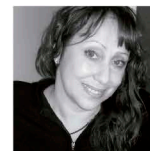

Vincent is a moving chair that treads around the floor, achieving movement dynamics from a comfortable posture adopted by the user regardless of which direction it is moving in.

Its shape allows different sitting positions that adapt both to relaxing, working and to recreational postures. Its ergonomics adapt the seat to the human body in such a way as to mimics the experience of being inside a FORMULA 1 cockpit.

Vincent features a wireless command that controls all its displacement movements, and includes a manual functioning option that saves electric energy and favours physical activity.

It also features a range of accessories which could be added according to the various needs of the user, such as audio, lighting, climate control and support. As an energy-saving option, it also includes a moving aspiration and sweeping system.
